ECL 2040 revision – what changes

Targets for 2030, 2040 and 2050

2050: Art. 2(1) remains unchanged:

> "Union-wide greenhouse gas emissions and removals regulated in Union law shall be balanced within the Union at the latest by 2050 [...]."

2030: Art. 4(1) remains unchanged:

➤ "In order to reach the climate-neutrality objective set out in Article 2(1), the binding Union 2030 climate target shall be a domestic reduction of net greenhouse gas emissions (emissions after deduction of removals) by at least 55% [...]."

2040: New Art.4(3)

➤ "In order to reach the climate-neutrality objective set out in Article 2(1), the binding Union 2040 climate target shall be a reduction of net greenhouse gas emissions (emissions after deduction of removals) by 90% [...J."

ECL 2040 revision - 'flexibilities'



- 2040 target includes 'enabling policies'
 - From 2036, 3% of international carbon credits "verifiable", "certifiable" "additional".
 - Integrate domestic permanent carbon removals into **EU ETS** to compensate hard-to-abate sectors.
 - Cross-sector **flexibility** between 2030 and 2040, compensating hard-to-abate sectors with emission reduction overachieving in other sectors.

Exceptions for hard-to-abate sectors will increase domestic pollution, leading to additional premature deaths and costs of inaction.*

- Risking higher air pollution deaths...
 - above the projected drop from 466,000 (2015) to 196,000 (2040)—and
 reducing potential health cost savings from €1,700 billion to €670 billion.
- ...and higher cost of inaction
 - Between 2031-2050, they could amount to EUR 2.4 trillion in the EU, compared to the costs associated to 1.5°C pathway.

2040 revision – What to expect



- Negotiations with Parliament and MS (**Trilogue** process)
 - Amendment of European Climate Law
 - Patriots won the right to lead on the file
 - NDC 2035 in September (?)
- Series of **impact assessments** resulting in 2040 policy package
 - "The Commission shall ensure that the following elements are appropriately reflected in the legislative proposals"
 - "The social, economic and environmental impacts"
 - "The costs of inaction and the benefits of action over mid-term to long-term"
- Legislative proposals will determine level of ambition:
 - Separate targets
 - Quantity of international credits 2036-2049
 - ETS reform
 - O ...

ECAP – Legal & Non-Legal Elements



European Climate Adaptation Plan

- 1) Proposal for a smart legal framework for climate resilience
 - Climate/temperature reference scenarios
 - Risk ownership at local, regional & national levels
 - Deploying resilience by design across sectors
- 3) Tools and citizens/businesses empowerment
- 4) Competitiveness and opportunities

5) Finance and insurance

ECAP – What to expect



Publication of ECAP expected in 2026

- July 2025 start of Impact Assessment process
 - July 15* Call for Evidence published (open for 4 weeks)
 - October/November 2025 Open Public Consultation (12 weeks)
 - 2026: further consultations with citizens and stakeholders
 - 4Q/2026: adoption of the package
 - Further consultations to be scheduled, including with Parliament

Climate spending on adaptation in post-2027 MFF

- Preparedness by design + resilience by design as cross-cutting principles in the post-2027 MFF:
 - Preparedness: reactive approach to short-term post-crisis management
 - Resilience: long-term measures to improve adaptive capacities

Post-2027 MFF – Climate Spending



European Commission

- June 11: meeting with Budget Commission Serafin's cabinet w/Green NGOs
 - No decision on climate and biodiversity spending
 - Showed a narrow view on zero pollution, mainly decarbonisation
 - Climate spending will be in line with 2035 and 2030 climate targets
 - Included in both Competitiveness Fund and National and Regional Partnership Plans
 - Own Resources (EU tax & joint debt) being considered

Member States

FR and DK supportive to climate spending and fossil fuel phase out;
 DE unclear; DK presidency will kickstart policy debate on MFF

Member States need to hear the urgency of greater investments in environment and health, and climate adaptation

NECPs & SCPs – the latest from MS



National Energy and Climate Plans (NECPs)

- 28 May 2025: Commission published EU-wide assessment of final updated NECPs
- Only some final plans sufficiently integrate preparedness and resilience to climate impacts.
- Most plans lack clear timelines and concrete ff phase-out measures.
- On Just transition, plans lack details of the social and employment impacts, particularly for vulnerable households, workers, and regions; + lack data for preparing their Social Climate Plans
- Poland missed deadline to submit its NECP

Social Climate Plans (SCPs)

- Linked to Social Climate Fund (2026–2032) targeting vulnerable groups, with direct income support and investments in clean energy, heating/cooling, and sustainable mobility, with up to €65B from ETS revenues, reaching €86.7B with national co-financing.
- 26 out of 27 MS missed 30 June deadline to send their SCPs, except Sweeden

Opportunities under DK Presidency



Past advocacy efforts

- Polish Presidency repeatedly tried to undermine 2040 climate ambition, together with France, reportedly.
- Meanwhile, HEAL has been vocal on the urgency of keeping climate ambition high and step up climate resilience to protect people's lives through:
 - Letters to Environment and Climate Ministers (June 17)
 - Letter to Heads of States (June 26/27)
 - Press Release on 2040 proposal (July 2)
 - Private outreach to National permanent representatives

<u>DK Presidency Programme</u> environment priorities [July 1 – December 31]

- Will "prioritise negotiations" on revising the European Climate Law to set a binding emissions reduction goal for 2040.
- Will discuss "the EU's environmental policy towards 2030".
